Emergency Services

424 families served

Through 15 AWESOME classes we were able to award \$28,125.00 in stipend assistance; we partnered with the Shenango Valley Foundation to serve an additional 27 families in crisis.



Family Supportive Services

84 people served

We assisted 28 women, 13 men, and 43 children throughout the year as they learned and grew as families and became more stable, sustainable households together.



Food Program

18,320 food bags provided

Our monthly food distribution list serves an average of 260 families per month. Volunteers and staff members help put our senior and shut-in delivery bags together each month.



Mission Thrift Store

2,789 customers served

We now look forward to seeing our regular customers and greeting them with complimentary coffee and snacks! We also feature a display of how many families we are able to help thanks to store sales.



Summer Activities

506 meals served

Our summer block party was a huge hit! A clown troupe, a petting zoo, and other local agencies were among the entertainment this year.
